## FIVE-O IN CYBERSPACE

# HAWAII FIVE-O GETS OWN USENET NEWSGROUP

Hawaii Five-O has a cyberspace home, the Usenet newsgroup alt.fan.hawaii-five-o. That may mean nothing to those without computers, but to those fans with computers and an Internet gateway or connection, it means contact with a wide variety of Five-O fans and lurkers. Already described by one fan on the newsgroup is "The McGarrett Syndrome" which is defined generally as the inability of any marksman, no matter how well-armed, to hit a completely stationary target who happens to be the central character in a particular television series. There has also been a lively discussion of continuity errors in episodes, and of the marvelous music of Hawaii Five-O. One member said that a prominent music magazine, Film Score Monthly, recently characterized the Five-O music as "the greatest TV title sequence ever". We knew that!

The newsgroup seemed to get off to a shaky start, according to Irregulars member and cyberspace denizen Mike Quigley of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. He found the newsgroup listed on his Internet server one day and was ecstatic. The next day, it seemed to have mysteriously disappeared. Just as mysteriously, like the mythical town of Brigadoon, it reappeared a day later. In that one day, it acquired 22 messages

in its base. Now that your editor has visited, it has many more!

America Online users can access alt.fan.hawaii-five-o even though it may not be listed in the "New Newsgroups" section in the Newsgroups area in the Internet Connection. When AOL users get into the Newsgroups area, they should look for the button marked "Expert Add", to add a newsgroup. Click on that button, enter the exact newsgroup name alt.fan.hawaii-five-o, and it will be added to the user's newsgroups list (which is accessed under the button marked "Read My Newsgroups").

#### PROGRAM NOTES

HAWAII FIVE-O

In Color, Wednesdays, 10:00-11:00 PM

Season Premiere: Wednesday, September 24, 1969

HAWAII FIVE-O-- described by critics as a police drama "which goes far beyond normal range of such formats and encompasses international intrigue and espionage with a highly professional touch" -- begins its second season on the CBS Televison Network, September 24. Starring Jack Lord as the head of Hawaii's special state police unit, the action-packed series filmed on location continues in the 10:00-11:00 time period.

Five-O is again assigned the "big" jobs the cases too hot for any other agency to handle. Steve McGarrett (Lord) is a master-planner and "a cop who cares." James MacArthur plays McGarrett's young first assistant, Danny Williams, a valedictorian while at the police academy. Hawaiian actors Kam Fong and Zulu are featured respectively as Kono and Chin Ho Kelly, both physically huge and mentally quick. Richard Denning frequently appears as the governor of the fiftieth state.

A newcomer to the HAWAII FIVE-O cast is Patricia Tuscano, who is cast as Jenny, McGarrett's secretary. Miss Tuscano is a veteran of three years at the Newcastle (Pa.) Playhouse.

The first season of HAWAII FIVE-O was filmed entirely on the island of Oahu, and the vivid realism captured in each episode compensated for the problems encountered in adapting equipment and transporting machinery and personnel. For the first five shows alone, the crew traveled to 90 different shooting sites. This year, Executive Producer Leonard Freeman wants to show even more of the natural phenomena of Hawaii and expand his schedule to include sites in as many of the six islands as possible. Hawaii's Kona Coast and landmarks on Kauai, Maui and Molokai are tentatively planned for use in the 1969-1970 season.

Another production advancement for the show is the construction of Hawaii's first permanent sound stage at Fort Ruger, near Diamond Head in Honolulu. A converted warehouse in Pearl City had been used for FIVE-O's initial season. The new structure contains 12,000 square feet of space, and Freeman estimates several thousand dollars per episode will be saved by eliminating the need to transport equipment and personnel to and from the old site.

Among the scheduled series guest stars this season are Ricardo Montalban, Theodore Bikel, Jackie Coogan, Brandon de Wilde, Jason Evers, Henry Silva, William Windom and Albert Paulsen.

Two new members of the HAWAII FIVE-O production staff are Producer Leonard Katzman, who will be based in Hawaii, and Associate Producer Larry Stewart, at CBS Studio Center in Hollywood. Katzman was formerly the producer of the "Wild Wild West" television series, and Stewart was an associate producer at Columbia Pictures for the past eight years.

It should be noted that Patricia Tuscano made only one appearance as Jenny, in "To Hell With Babe Ruth" (#25). The next week, in "Forty Feet High, and It Kills" (#26), Peggy Ryan took over the role of Jenny Sherman.

## LITERATE FIVE-O

To Hell With Babe Ruth (#25) -- The title comes from phrases Japanese pilots shouted into their radios as they staged the bombing of Pearl Harbor: "To Hell with Babe Ruth! To Hell with Franklin Roosevelt! To Hell with Roy Acuff!" (Roy Acuff was a country singer known as the King of Country Music; he was a fixture at the Grand Old Opry for many years.) This verbal attack on American cultural and political icons was supposed to be demoralizing to our troops.

# Ed Flanders; Actor Starred in 'St. Elsewhere'

DENNY, Calif.—Ed Flanders, the Emmy-winning actor whose "St. Elsewhere" television character left the show by mooning the audience, died last week at his home in Trinity County.

Flanders, 60, died Feb. 22 at his home in Denny, a mountain town about 280 miles north of San Francisco, Coroner Bill Fischer said Wednesday.

The family has asked that details of his death not be released, Fischer said. A funeral home spokesman in nearby Weaverville said Flanders' body was cremated and no funeral was planned.

Flanders played the kindhearted chief of staff Dr. Donald Westphall on NBC-TV's "St. Elsewhere" from 1982 to 1987.

When he left the show in 1987 to pursue other projects, his character told off his new fictional boss by dropping his pants and baring his behind. The shot of his rear was frozen as credits rolled.

Network officials said the mooning drew fewer than three dozen complaints.

Flanders returned in 1988 for the show's farewell episode. He was supposed to talk about beginnings and endings at St. Eligius Hospital, but instead delivered an unscripted soliloguy on death.

The surprised producers were upset, but later decided to leave in the rambling speech.

"Ed Flanders was a critical part of a series that represents some of the best in the history of NBC's programming," said Warren Littlefield, president of NBC Enter-

tainment. "He was a consummate actor who will be missed."

Flanders won an Emmy for his "St. Elsewhere" role and another for his portrayal of President Harry S. Truman in a 1976 PBS special. Flanders received an Emmy and a Tony for his role in the television and stage versions of the play "A Moon for the Misbegotten."

His television credits included "Special Bulletin," "Backstairs at the White House," "Things in Their Season," "Mary White," "The Amazing Howard Hughes," "The Perfect Tribute" and the Truman one-man show, "Plain Speaking."

Flanders played Leonard Garment, an aide to President Richard Nixon, in the 1989 ABC television movie "The Final Days." Most recently, he played a father in the 1993 Danielle Steel miniseries "Message From Nam" and Karen Allen's father in the unsuccessful series "Road Home" in March, 1994.

Edward Paul Flanders was born in Minneapolis. He moved to California, where he became a member of the Globe Theatre Company in San Diego.

#### Flanders death a suicide

Actor Ed Flanders, known for his role in the "St. Elsewhere" television show, died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head, according to authorities. Flanders, 60, died Feb. 22 at his home in Denny, Calif. (HR 3.2). Initial reports of his death did not include a cause, but the official death certificate lists suicide, according to the coroner's office.

These two items were sent in by Paul Coyle.

Ed Flanders appeared in the episodes "Up Tight", "Three Dead Cows at Makapuu", "The Guarnerius Caper", "While You're At It, Bring In the Moon", "One Born Every Minute", and "And the Horse Jumped Over the Moon."

He was a gifted actor and will be missed.

#### WHEN DOES THE WAR END?

Episode 233 March 16, 1978 Production No. 0719 (Summary prepared by Reg Jones)

Properties belonging to Yuhio Muromoto (Bennett Ohta) are bombed by Willy Barker (David Dukes), a student in his daughter Nancy's (Donna Benz) photography class. Only Ohta's confidential secretary, Alicia (Anne Francis), knows about the phone threats he's been receiving.

McGarrett concludes that the bombings are personally motivated and begins checking up on Muromoto's life before he came to the Islands. A visit with the Japanese consul, Mr. Sakata (Tom Fujiwara), yields nothing. However, Steve's belief is reinforced when lab findings reveal that the third blast was set off by a WW II hand grenade and a fourth by a land mine.

Chin Ho's investigation of the source of the explosives reveals that they were sold to a Charlie Mitchell in Honolulu. When the Five-0 team arrives at his apartment, they learn that he has recently died and the room taken over by a Willy Barker. Danny remembers meeting Barker who was with Nancy at the last blast site.

Meanwhile, Willy has lured Nancy into a photographic field trip. When they arrive at Mitchell's cane field compound, Willy ties her up and calls Muromoto. He says it's too late for Muromoto to confess his sins in public, now he must do as ordered or his daughter will die. Muromoto agrees.

Only minutes after Muromoto has left in his car, McGarrett arrives. When he learns of the phone call and Nancy's field trip with Willy, he calls out the HPD choppers to look for Muromoto's car. The car is soon spotted, and McGarrett and Danny are given direction from the air.

Muromoto arrives at the compound and is himself tied up. Willy claims that Muromoto was the commander of a death camp on Bataan and that he executed Willy's father. Charlie Mitchell saw it happen. Nancy wants to know how he can prove it after so many years. Simple. Muromoto told everything to his "trusted" secretary, Alicia, when they were lovers. Now she wants revenge because he failed to marry her after his wife died.

Alicia orders the programmed Willy to kill Muromoto but he drifts into a catatonic state. As Alicia tries to tongue-lash him into action, McGarrett and Danny arrive to arrest the pair. A reporter (Joshua Bryant), who had trailed McGarrett to the site, asks whether his story should be about WW II. Steve says, "The real story is about people who won't let go of hate, and what it does to them and others."

NOTE: Tom Fujiwara looked very official with a conservative suit and slicked down hair, but he couldn't suppress that sweet smile of his at the end of the scene.
